Licensing your pet



The first step towards responsible pet ownership is to license your cat or dog!

Your cat or dog's licence is his ticket home. Licensing your pet provides Animal & Bylaw Services with the information needed to reunite your pet with you should he ever become lost.

A licence tag also tells people who may find your cat or dog that the animal is owned and that they should turn him in to Animal & Bylaw Services.

Under the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw 23M2006, by three months of age, all cats and dogs residing in Calgary must be licensed with The City of Calgary Animal & Bylaw Services.

Cat and dog licences must be renewed annually.

A ONE-YEAR LICENCE FOR:	COST
Altered cats and kittens (up to six months old)	\$15
Unaltered cats	\$30
Altered dogs and puppies (up to six months old)	\$36
Unaltered dogs	\$58

Animal & Bylaw Services enforces a zero tolerance policy on all unlicensed cats and dogs with a penalty of \$250.

The value of licensing

Your licence fees, not tax dollars, allow Animal & Bylaw Services to:

- Return lost cats and dogs to their owners and enforce the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw.
- Deliver community programs and educate animal owners about responsible pet ownership.
- Feed and shelter lost cats and dogs at the Animal Services Centre.
- Operate a state-of-the-art veterinary clinic to provide care for adoptable cats and dogs.
- Operate our animal adoption and volunteer animal socialization programs.
- Provide funding to community veterinary clinics for emergency medical care for injured stray cats and dogs.
- Help neighbours resolve animal-related conflicts.
- Provide free spay or neuter surgeries for the cats and dogs of low-income Calgarians.

In addition, owners of licensed pets will receive an ***I Heart My Pet*** rewards card, providing discounts on products and services at a wide array of partnering vendors. Visit iheartmypet.ca for details.

If your cat or dog is lost:

- Call 311 to file a lost pet report.
- Check the pictures of the impounded and adoptable animals listed on calgary.ca/animalservices.
- Download the free City of Calgary Pets app to your mobile phone so you can check if your pet has been brought to the Animal Services Centre while you are out looking for him.
- Visit the Animal Services Centre (2201 Portland St. S.E.) to see if your lost cat or dog is in our facility. It is easier to identify your pet in person than by looking at photos.

If you move or change your phone number, remember to update your contact information with Animal & Bylaw Services by calling 311. Also update your information with your microchip or tattoo provider.

If your cat or dog is licensed, the chance of him finding his way home is dramatically increased.
